CONDITIONS: BASKET SIZE 35cm (14") or 40cm (16") wire basket with coconut or husk liner

Will be judged on the following: Featuring new methods; advanced and original. Introducing new ideas; original and creative in thinking.

CONDITIONS:

Plants must be living and growing in the potting mix within the basket.

There must be at least one living plant in the basket entry.

Accessories may be used but must be complimentary to the basket design and not predominate.

There are no restrictions on the plants used other than they must not be a declared noxious weed.

Entries that have visible signs of disease or other cultural problems may be refused entry.

Staging of Entries:

Exhibitors are to deliver their entries to the show pavilion prior to Saturday 12 AUGUST.
